

**Film Streams Introduces Teacher-Appreciation Discount
for all screenings at the Ruth Sokolof Theater**

Omaha, Nebraska (August 20, 2008)—Film Streams, the nonprofit organization that operates the two-screen Ruth Sokolof Theater in Omaha's north downtown neighborhood, announces a new ticket discount for teachers who present their school ID at the box office.

Teachers of all grade levels (including college and university instructors) can now purchase movie tickets for \$6 when they present their school identifications. Regular adult admission at the theater is \$8. Students and seniors also pay \$6, and Film Streams Members enjoy a special discount price of \$4.

Open seven days a week, Film Streams' Ruth Sokolof Theater features new American independents, foreign films and documentaries, as well as a repertory program of classic movies, themed series and director retrospectives.

The nonprofit cinema also presents a wide variety of educational and community development programs, including lectures, forums, Q&A's with visiting filmmakers, and panel discussions. Film Streams is currently piloting an Arts in Education program for area high school students. The program is designed to teach students how to interpret films in a cultural context, empathize with characters in ways that are beneficial to their own personal development, and analyze film as an art form.
