**Film Streams and Computers for Africa  
Present the 2007 Academy Award Nominated WAR DANCE**

**Omaha, Nebraska (September 24, 2008)**—A 2007 Oscar-nominated documentary will receive its Omaha premiere in October as a result of a special collaboration between Film Streams at the Ruth Sokolof Theater and Computers for Africa.

The two nonprofit organizations will present a special screening of **WAR DANCE on Tuesday, October 14, at 6:30 p.m.** at Film Streams' Ruth Sokolof Theater, located at the corner of 14th and Webster within the Saddle Creek Records development.

A powerful, emotionally-charged documentary about the resiliency of the human spirit, **WAR DANCE** tells the courageous story of a group of children living in a displaced persons camp in northern Uganda, a country ravaged by more than two decades of civil war. Their families torn apart, their homes destroyed, and their innocence lost, these children are overwhelmed by the brutal realities of their lives. It is against this tragic backdrop that students from the Patongo Primary School emerge in victory at a regional dance contest and qualify for the first time to compete in the prestigious national music competition in the capital city of Kampala.

Directed by husband and wife team Sean Fine and Andrea Nix, **WAR DANCE** is a revelatory film about the transformative power of art. The documentary received numerous festival awards throughout 2007, including the Best Documentary Director award at the Sundance Film Festival, and later earned an Oscar nomination.

The film will play for one night only at Film Streams' Ruth Sokolof Theater, as a partnership between the nonprofit cinema and Omaha-based Computers for Africa (CFA). Currently working in the northern Uganda regions of Gulu and Lira, CFA is dedicated to promoting sustainable Information and Communications Technology (ICT) development in rural African communities. The organization's approach involves sending quality hardware, educating for sustainability, maximizing positive impact, and strengthening community relationships.
